Outrage, violence, discord We are hearing of a world that is pulling itself apart. There are factions, opposing sides, extreme language and opinions being expressed. The people are feeling deeply unsettled by all of this. In today's first reading the prophet Habakkuk is as unsettled as anyone else. But he is also troubled by the fact that God seems not to be listening to his prayer as all this chaos is going on. Habakkuk asks why God seems only to look on 'while there is injustice and tyranny'. At last, the Lord speaks to Habakkuk's heart: "*See how he flags, he whose soul is not at rights. But the upright person will live by his faithfulness*". Today's readings encourage us to deepen our faith and trust in God. Perhaps we can start this journey with a small step. Take only a few moments; ask God to help you trust him and to have confidence in God during today.

'Northern Cross': news from across our diocese available today.

Partnership: Recently we had a statement at mass about church properties in our area. The statement pointed out that, between 1985 and 2017, mass attendance in our diocese fell by 64% (100,000 to 31,000). This means that, across the diocese, we now have many buildings that are under-used. This situation places an increasing burden on parish volunteers to manage the properties, and to maintain them. Our Partnership is being asked to look ahead to 2030 (*just over ten years from now*) to identify our priorities in relation to the buildings that we have. Each parish is being asked to conduct a Community Audit to look at our own buildings. It would be good to have some people from our parishes assist with this. There will be a couple of workshops to guide us with this. Perhaps you would like to help

John Henry Newman: Newman was an Anglican clergyman born in 1801. He was both a scholar and a man of deep faith who felt increasingly drawn to the Catholic church. He was eventually welcomed into the Church as a Catholic in 1845. His views on the significance of each individual's conscience, and his understanding of how church doctrine is not 'static' but must always 'develop', contributed greatly to the Church's rediscovery of its identity and mission at the Second Vatican Council over a hundred years later (1962-64). John Henry Newman is to be formally recognised to be a saint by Pope Francis in Rome next Sunday.

Preparing for sacraments: On Wednesday evening we had a preliminary meeting for parents to introduce our approach to preparing for Reconciliation and Holy Communion over the next few months. This is for children in Year 4 or above who have already been baptised Catholic and our programme is designed to support children and their parents to deepen their faith in God and to feel more a part of our faith-community. If parents feel that they and their children are ready to share in this 'journey of faith' then perhaps they could let me have their completed yellow sheets by this Monday evening. You can either drop them off at the Parish Office at St Joseph's, Ushaw Moor or leave at the office of your child's primary school. Once we know how many families are wanting to participate in this preparation we will contact you with further information.
