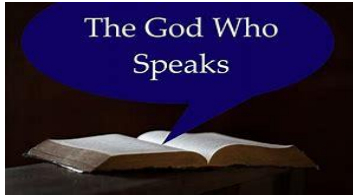

'The God who Speaks' : You may have heard about '*The God who Speaks*' . This is a national venture to encourage us to engage more with God's word in the bible. Over the next

One thing we are planning in our partnership is a very basic introduction to the bible. I did wonder if, in advance of that, there might be any interest in a *very basic introduction* to that introduction! I would be very happy to offer a few sessions to give something of the background storyline of the bible. This would not be over academic, but I hope it could prove to be helpful. Pastoral Council : At our recent Pastoral Council, it was felt while we had been invited to celebrate our Holy Week services at Ushaw College this year we sensed a preference that our services take place in our own churches. We also looked at the following areas that we might focus on in our pastoral approach: welcoming and communication, young people, outreach, prayer and spirituality, buildings and maintenance. It was also suggested that photographs of Pastoral Council members be displayed at the back of each church so that parishioners could identify who those members are.

This next meeting will be held in the Ushaw Moor Catholic Club on Tuesday, January 28th at 6.30pm (Refreshments) for a 7.00pm start. A Prayer by Thomas Merton: "My God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I *think* I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that *the desire* to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it. Therefore, I will trust you always though I may seem to be lost in the shadow of death. I will not fear for you are ever with me and you will never leave me to face my perils alone."

Holocaust Memorial Day: In our diocese it is now become a significant occasion in the diary to celebrate Holocaust Memorial Day. This usually involves a survivor of the concentration camps giving a talk about experiences in the camps, and also about attitudes since. This year sees the 75th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz. We are invited to go along to St Michael's RC Secondary School, Beamish Road, Billingham, TS23 3DX on Thursday, January 30th, 7.00 – 9.00pm. All welcome.

Next weekend: Next weekend we will celebrate the feast of the Presentation of the Lord when, forty days after his birth, Jesus was brought to the Temple in Jerusalem. This was a regular thing for parents to give thanks to God for the birth of a child, but it was also their opportunity to present Jesus to God for whatever task God had in mind for their child. At that stage, however, could Mary and Joseph have even guessed what that might be for Jesus! The feast is also known as 'Candlemas' because Jesus is offered as 'a light to enlighten all nations'.

'Lepra': In two weeks' time we will have guest speaker coming to our masses to speak about 'Lepra'. This is a charity which seeks to relieve the effects of leprosy which is still a very disease in our world. Even a small amount of money can go a long way in benefiting someone suffering from leprosy.
