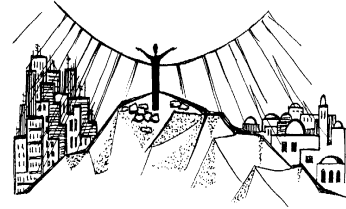

1ST SUNDAY OF LENT

Being fed, being nourished We all want to make sense of our lives. Including Jesus. And Jesus could be tempted, just as we can. A great temptation for Jesus, as we hear today, was to 'have things', things that don't necessarily last. So, when he was hungry, the tempter said, 'You could turn these stones into loaves of bread'. But Jesus resisted that temptation saying, 'Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God'. It is God's word that nourishes us, inwardly. Today, at mass, we will hear a message from Bishop Robert. He will tell us about 'The God who Speaks', an encouragement to all of us to take up reading the bible regularly. There will also be an information sheet available after mass. There are also the daily reflections for Lent at the back of church. Please take one each weekend.

We will think about how important it is to be able to say 'sorry' and, no less significantly, how important it is for us to be able to accept forgiveness from others. This will be followed up next Sunday at 4.00pm when we will have a parish Service of Reconciliation in which our children will celebrate their First Confessions. This service will be at Newhouse.

Family Fast Day Next Friday (March 6th), we will have our Lenten Fast Day. Collections for prisoners being released from local prisons: 'Nepacs' is a north east charity which has been supporting people affected by imprisonment for over 135 years. Once again, we would like to collect items for 'nepacs' to make up Toiletry and Homeless Packs for prisoners being released who are in particular need. Our previous collections have been greatly appreciated. Useful items to contribute to the Toiletry Packs are toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, shower gel, soap, deodorant (roll-on or spray), flannels, combs and wet wipes. Packs for anyone who is homeless on their release also include socks, plasters, waterbottle/flask, bacterial gel, and a dry food pack (coffee, tea bags, hot chocolate powder, cup-a-soup, cereal bars, sugar, stirrer, Mars Bars). In addition, the packs for HMP Low Newton need lip balm and Sanitary Pack (STs, tampons, panty liners), and those for HMP Durham need disposable razors and shaving foam. Please bring any items to your church and they will be passed on from there.
