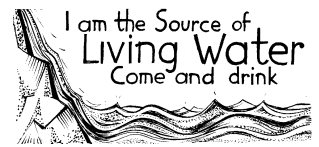

**Feeling thirsty:** Have you ever felt thirsty, *really* thirsty? When your tongue is sticking to the roof of your mouth and you can't talk properly? When you are desperate for some water? Then read today's first reading, and then the gospel. At a deeper level, what are you most thirsting for in your life? Jesus can quench that thirst!

**Corona-virus:** The best precaution against passing on any germs seems to be frequent and thorough washing hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and hot water. Our bishops have also said that, for the duration, we should not receive from the chalice at Holy Communion, should receive the host only in our hand (not on the tongue), not shake hands at the sign of peace, not use the holy water, and that Holy Communion ministers use antiseptic gel before and after distributing Holy Communion. Advice is continually being updated by the Chief Medical Officer. It is important that we take note of this ongoing advice.

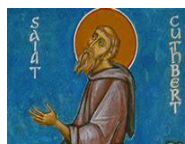

**Finchale Partnership Prayer & Spirituality:** In the first of a series of sessions on different prayers and devotions, we'll be talking about the Stations of the Cross. We'll be exploring the history and practice of the Stations, so whether you are very familiar with praying the Stations, or if you've seen them in church and simply want to know how it works, join us on Thursday 2nd April at 7.00pm, at St. Cuthbert's, Old Elvet, Durham. There will be a talk, the opportunity to ask questions and we will finish with Stations of the Cross in church.

**Academies:** In our diocese of Hexham and Newcastle we have 156 schools educating 53,000 children. The plan is that all these schools, both primary and secondary, should become academies within one of four Diocesan Education Trusts by July 2022. Underpinning this move is the desire and need to ensure the promotion, preservation, protection and future development of Catholic education in our diocese so that it is fit for the mission of the Church. This formation into academies means that no individual school will be left isolated or vulnerable in a rapidly changing environment. Our aim is to facilitate greater sharing, adding strength and capacity to the system and ensuring all schools are supported and included. The four Diocesan Education Trusts or 'multi-academies' will be named after four of the early bishops of our diocese. Our own schools will be part of the 'Bishop Wilkinson Catholic Education Trust'. Bishop Thomas Wilkinson was bishop from 1889 – 1909 and is now buried at Ushaw College. More information is available at the back of church in the form of a letter that has been sent out to parents.
